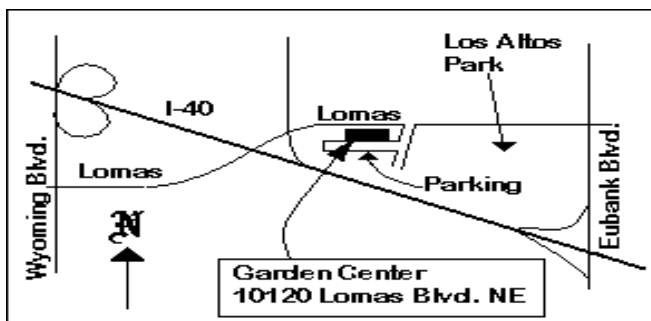

What's New for Bus Trips?

Our first bus trip is to Crested Butte, CO, over the Martin Luther King holiday weekend on **Friday - Monday, January 17-20, 2014.**

Crested Butte has been a favorite for the Club! It offers numerous skiing opportunities for all skill levels, and Nordic and alpine ski areas. A bus shuttle will take skiers to the ski area and it has drop offs throughout the historic town.



Once again, we will stay at the Old Town Inn. It is within walking distance to the historic main street and numerous restaurants. It is also close to a ski shop that has great Nordic equipment. We will have a continental breakfast each morning, freshly made cookies after skiing and access to an outdoor hot tub.

A new destination this season is to Steamboat Springs, CO, on **Friday - Monday, February 21-24, 2014.** Steamboat Springs is a little further than our previous trips, but Bill White, Co-Bus Trip Chair, worked with the bus company to make this happen. We are excited because we have heard so many good things about the skiing in this area.

Bill made an exploratory trip to check it out and we found a great place to stay at the Nordic Lodge, located near the alpine ski area and within walking or shuttle distance to the hot springs. We will have continental breakfasts, hot tub access and friendly hosts. Steamboat is a historic town with shops, restaurants and great skiing.

BETTY BEAR HUT
January 27 – February 1

Betty Bear is found at just over 11,000 feet near Basalt, Colorado. We last visited this unusual hut in 2003. Sleeping quarters are located

downstairs, which is heated by its own wood burning stove. The upstairs common area is spacious and sunny. Day skiing options around the hut include moderate Nordic touring as well as turning opportunities.

This trip is suitable for strong intermediate hut skiers. The first five miles are on a gentle road, but the last two miles go steeply uphill with many vexing switchbacks. As of press time, 7 vacancies remain.

Sign-up Now for Bus Trips

Instructions:

- ◀ Before registering, please read the complete Club policy on long trips that is posted on the website (www.nmccskiclub.org) as well as the Bus Trip Guidelines below.
- ◀ Enclosed in this newsletter you will find registration forms.
- ◀ Registration form/deposit must be received by **Saturday November 16, 2014**. You can either:
 - Mail** to Celeste Taylor-Ryman, 701 Madison ST. NE, Albuquerque, NM 87110
 - Bring** to October or November Club meeting
- ◀ Please bring separate registration forms and separate deposit checks for each trip.
- ◀ If you want a specific roommate, you must both register on one form and submit checks together.
- ◀ As long as the registration for bus trip seats exceeds availability, we will hold a lottery drawing for the seats. Board members are given first priority for seats as an incentive to serve this organization.
- ◀ After all seats for a trip are filled, we will place the remaining registrations in a "reserve pool" and their original checks will be destroyed. We will keep registrations for those in the reserve pool unless notified they are no longer interested in that trip.
- ◀ Once your registration has been accepted, you own the seat and owe the balance for the trip (*please note the balance due date on the registration form*).
- ◀ The roster of attendees for all trips will be posted on the website and listed in the newsletter.
- ◀ Complete details of the trips will be e-mailed to participants (*if they have e-mail*) four weeks prior to the trip, otherwise it will be snail-mailed.
- ◀ **If you do not receive notifications in a timely manner, it is your responsibility to contact us for the information at 505-366-4959 or celestet86@gmail.com.**

Guidelines:

Who may go: Paid up Club members (dues paid by the November meeting) at least 18 years old or at least 12 if accompanied by a paying parent/guardian/grandparent.

Departure: Times will depend on the trip so check the individual trip descriptions. The bus departs from the parking lot on the west side of the Target at I-25 and Paseo Del Norte. The Bus Trip Chair will be in the parking lot one hour before departure to load the bus and pass out boarding passes in the order of your arrival. You may reserve one seat per pass. The bus will

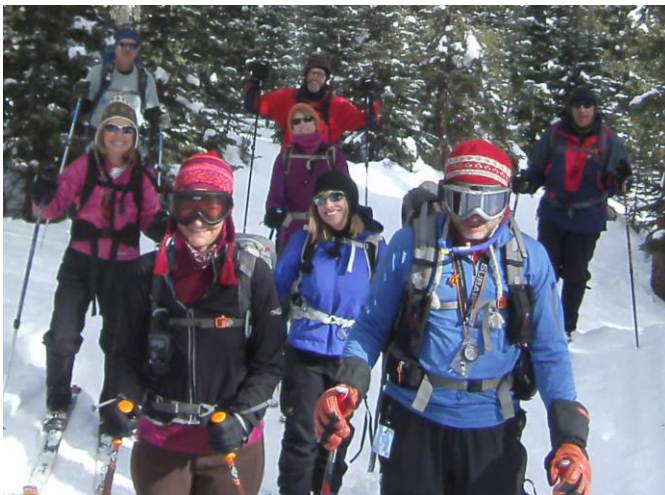
board ½ hour before the scheduled departure time. If everyone is on the bus ahead of departure time, we could leave early!

Bus Ride: The Club supplies cold sodas, water, wine, beer and light snacks on the bus. There is a restroom on the bus; however, use is up to the discretion of the driver.

Luggage: Pack your skis in a ski bag. You are allowed one large or two small suitcases per person. Cargo area is at a premium so please pack minimally and be considerate of others. You may bring a six pack cooler (*no larger than 8-1/2"Wx12"Lx9-1/2"H*) that must fit under your seat.

Clothes: "Casual, warm and layered" are the key words. We often walk to dinner so bring warm clothing for evenings. Slip-on crampons (*Yak traks*) are useful.

Meals: Meals are provided as outlined in each trip description. All other meals are your responsibility. Cooking is not allowed in hotel rooms. You may bring breakfast and lunch foods in your cooler. You must bring your own food and water when going out to ski. On ski days, the bus normally leaves the hotel at about 8 or 9 a.m. and returns to the hotel in the late afternoon.

Skiing: We attempt to go to a variety of areas to accommodate skiers of all abilities. There will be set-track areas and/or downhill skiing available in both locations, but our main pursuit is cross-country skiing.

Cost: The cost of the trip is derived from the estimated cost of the bus, hotel, drinks, snacks, included meals, club surcharge, and bus driver's tip divided by the number of people on the trip. Once you have paid your deposit you are on the trip. The balance is due by the dates given on the trip reservation form.

Payments are not refundable: If you cancel, you must find a substitute (*same sex member of the*

Club) and settle the payment with that person. You will get names of people in reserve pool.

Reserve: The "Reserve Pool" will be started once a trip is full. It costs nothing to be on "reserve status".

Club Cancellation Policy

In the event that a bus trip cannot be completed due to events beyond Club control, such as weather, road conditions, mechanical failure, etc. any money that is not already committed will be equally divided and distributed among trip participants. ■
