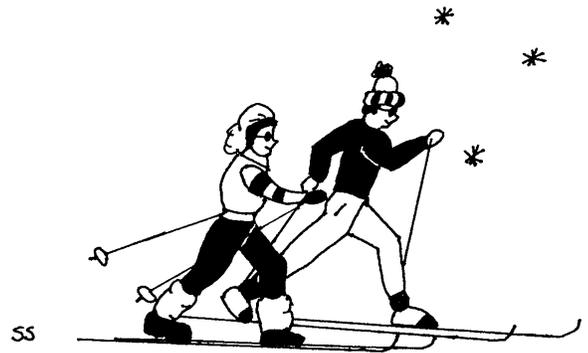

**Next meeting:** Thursday December 19, 7:30pm



### Beginning Cross-Country Ski Lessons

The New Mexico Cross Country Ski Club will offer a class for beginning skiers. Although the class is primarily geared toward the absolute beginner, it can also be beneficial for those with some experience.

The class will consist of a single two-hour classroom session and one all-day on-the-snow session. Participants must be at least 18 years of age unless approved in advance by instructor, and must be members of the club. The cost of the class is \$10.00.

Participants will learn the basics of skiing, and how to be confident and comfortable on the snow. Students must be reasonably fit and have a positive attitude!

*The classroom session will be Saturday December 21.* That's the Saturday after the December meeting, so just about your last chance to sign up will be at that meeting. If you want to take the class and you won't be at the meeting, call me before that date.

The on-the-snow session will tentatively be a Saturday in early-mid January. Further details will be announced at the meetings and published in the newsletter.

Often new skiers don't get started until the season is half over, so if you know of someone who might be interested, have them call me NOW !!!

### Climbing Skins – Special Purchase

I have arranged a purchase of climbing skins for those taking the Intermediate XC ski lessons and, through the good offices of Bob Greenwalt at Mountains and Rivers, this offer is being extended to all NMCCSC members.

These climbing skins are approximately 1/2-length glue-ons and should work in all but the steepest or most strenuous of situations. They are also called kicker stickers. I bought a pair last year and they worked fine with my no-wax skis on the Belvedere hut trip. (They work on both waxable and no-wax skis.)

The skins come in 5 widths. Mountains and Rivers recommends that you purchase skins about 5 mm narrower than the waist of your ski (the most narrow part, typically under your foot).

The five widths and their list prices are:

<u>width (mm)</u>	<u>width (inches)</u>	<u>list price</u>
48	1.89	\$47.50
55	2.17	\$48.50
60	2.36	\$49.50
64	2.52	\$52.50
70	2.76	\$54.50


Note: 1 inch is 25.4 mm. For example, if your skis are exactly 2 1/2 inches wide at their narrowest place, then they are 63.5 mm wide. You could use skins that are 55 or 60 mm wide.

Bob is offering these skins to us for 10% off the list price. We still have to pay sales tax – a little less than 6%.

If you are interested in this offer, please get to me a check for \$25, **payable to:** Mountains and Rivers. **ON YOUR CHECK, write the width of the skin** in which you are interested.

You may mail it to me at 3025 Palo Alto Dr NE, Albuquerque NM 87111 or give it to me at the December NMCCSC meeting. The deadline for getting your deposit to me is the evening of December 19. I will place the order the next day. At this point, the \$25 deposit is **non-refundable**.

When the skins come in, you must pay Mountains and Rivers the balance on them.

## Information for Skiers

**FOOD, WATER and EQUIPMENT:** Each skier brings all of his/her own equipment; skis, boots, poles, wax, warm clothes, food, water, etc. At least one quart of water per person and extra food for delays or emergencies should be carried.

**TRANSPORTATION:** Skiers should try to car pool from the meeting point to the ski trailhead. Drivers should be reimbursed 7.5 cents per mile by each passenger in a car pool. Approximate car mileage will be listed in the trip description.

**TOUR LEADERS:** Tour leaders are volunteers who plan and lead ski tours for NMCCSC members. A tour leader has the prerogative of rejecting any person as a tour member because of equipment, ability, or any other reason. Call the leader if you have questions about the tour.

**LIABILITY:** The NMCCSC is a non-profit organization in which all activities are carried out by volunteers. The Club, Club officers, trip leaders and

drivers assume no liability in connection with any Club activity. If you are concerned about accidents, either while skiing or traveling, you should obtain your own insurance policy.

**TOUR CLASSIFICATIONS:** The tour classification is an indication of the degree of difficulty of the trail and the corresponding skiing ability required to safely and enjoyably ski. Note that the length of the skiing portion of the trip is given in the trip description. The types of trails that each class of skier may be expected to navigate are given below:

**CLASS I:** A tour with less than 1000 feet of elevation gain and less than 5 miles in length, and can be skied by novice skiers with minimal cross country experience. **Persons with no cross country skiing experience MUST take beginning lessons or must obtain the leader's permission PRIOR to joining a Class I tour.**



**CLASS II:** A tour with 1000 to 2000 feet of elevation gain and less than 10 miles in length. The trail will have gentle to moderate slopes which require the ability to stop and turn on the slopes. A Class II+ tour will have 2000 to 3000 feet of elevation gain.

**CLASS III:** A tour with greater than 3000 feet of elevation gain and greater than 10 miles in length. The trail may be steep or narrow and requires at least intermediate to advanced skiing ability.




### Tues, Thurs, Sat, Sun Santa Fe and Sandias



A nice variety of ski terrain with fantastic views of Redondo Peak. This is a perennial club favorite and the snow is usually excellent. Pack a lunch and some

water, dress in layers. Call leader for meeting place and time.

**Winter Park – 4-5 day trip**

This trip will give priority to long ski-intensive days, with provisions for those who prefer shorter days. The main ski group will be on the road by 8:00am each day, returning late afternoon. Other groups (actually the majority!) will do shorter days.

We will be traveling by carpool, and staying in condos. Some will leave Thursday morning and drive directly to Winter Park. Others will leave Thursday evening, staying the night in Buena Vista. We will drive back starting Monday around noon.

Cost will be about \$300.-\$325., including all lodging and a contribution for the drivers.

Winter Park is at 9000' in northern Colorado, west of the Continental Divide. It usually has better (sometimes much better) snow conditions than southern Colorado. The Fraser Experimental Forest (no snowmobiles!) and two Wilderness areas are just outside town. Somewhat to the north are the Arapaho National Forest, Rocky Mountain National Park, and the Indian Peaks Wilderness. In addition, there are two large prepared-track areas, Devil's Thumb and Snow Mountain, each with 100 km of trails.

**Race information:** The Snow Mountain Stampede, a major regional ski race, will be held March 1, the Saturday we're there! There will be 10 km, 21 km, and 42 km events. We will try to accommodate those who wish to enter one of these events.
