

Next meeting: Thursday January 16, 7:30pm



- **Program:** See the video “Winning the Avalanche Game”, offering detailed instruction on avalanche safety.

This really is a wonderful trip. It is great for new members of the club, as we all soak in the hot springs (open 24 hours/day) and you get to meet everyone.



Information for Skiers

FOOD, WATER and EQUIPMENT: Each skier brings all of his/her own equipment; skis, boots, poles, wax, warm clothes, food, water, etc. At least one quart of water per person and extra food for delays or emergencies should be carried.

TRANSPORTATION: Skiers should try to car pool from the meeting point to the ski trailhead. Drivers should be reimbursed 7.5 cents per mile by each passenger in a car pool. Approximate car mileage will be listed in the trip description.

TOUR LEADERS: Tour leaders are volunteers who plan and lead ski tours for NMCCSC members. A tour leader has the prerogative of rejecting any person as a tour member because of equipment, ability, or any other reason. Call the leader if you have questions about the tour.

LIABILITY: The NMCCSC is a non-profit organization in which all activities are carried out by volunteers. The Club, Club officers, trip leaders and drivers assume no liability in connection with any Club activity. If you are concerned about accidents, either while skiing or traveling, you should obtain your own insurance policy.

TOUR CLASSIFICATIONS: The tour classification is an indication of the degree of difficulty of the trail and the corresponding skiing ability required to safely and enjoyably ski. Note that the length of the skiing portion of the trip is given in the trip description. The types of

trails that each class of skier may be expected to navigate are given below:

CLASS I: A tour with less than 1000 feet of elevation gain and less than 5 miles in length, and can be skied by novice skiers with minimal cross country experience. **Persons with no cross country skiing experience MUST take beginning lessons or must obtain the leader's permission PRIOR to joining a Class I tour.**

CLASS II: A tour with 1000 to 2000 feet of elevation gain and less than 10 miles in length. The trail will have gentle to moderate slopes which require the ability to stop and turn on the slopes. A Class II+ tour will have 2000 to 3000 feet of elevation gain.

CLASS III: A tour with greater than 3000 feet of elevation gain and greater than 10 miles in length. The trail may be steep or narrow and requires at least intermediate to advanced skiing ability.

Sat Jan 4 Jemez Mountains
Class I & II 3-6 miles roundtrip
Leader: Sam Beard, 828-0673

Leader will determine where to ski based on snow conditions. Enjoy the beautiful Jemez and escape the crowds in the Sandias. Meet at the Bank of America, corner of Academy and San Mateo, at 8:00 AM. Bring MaxiGlide for your no-wax skis to prevent sticking if the snow is wet. Leader is looking for a co-leader to lead either the Class I or Class II portion of the trip.



Sun Jan 5 Sandias – 10K Loop
Class III 6 miles roundtrip

Meet: WF 9:00am. Ski the 10K trail to Del Agua overlook, back on the North Crest trail, and return on the Switchback trail. The pace will be brisk and there are sections that are not for the beginner. This is a beautiful loop, fun ups and downs, and fewer people than on many of the upper Sandia trails.

Class II 10-12 miles roundtrip

Meet: BOA 8:00am. See page 35 of Sam Beard’s book for a description of this area of the Jemez Mountains. We will ski Fenton Hill Road as far as our time will allow. This day trip will be led at a Class II pace, as we would like to cover 5 to 6 miles of Route 144 before retracing our tracks back to the trailhead. Route 144 offers gently rolling hills as it meanders along Fenton Ridge. Bring 1½-2 liters of water, lunch and snacks, and enjoy a fun ski! Leader would like to carpool.



Sat Jan 11 San Pedro Parks, Jemez Mtns
Class III 10-15 miles roundtrip

Ski into the gorgeous San Pedro Parks Wilderness area. Quiet tree skiing with large open meadows where elk bugle in the fall. This is a perennial club favorite, but the ski out can be quite fast if conditions are icy. Trip is dependant on snow, call leader for meeting place and time.



Wed Jan 15 Los Griegos – Jemez Mountains
Class I-II 6 miles roundtrip

One of the nicest skis in this area, almost always the best snow due to the high elevation. Lots of tall pines with occasional great views out over the Jemez. We have seen elk up close on this trip before. Call leader for meeting place and time.



Sat Jan 25 East Fork – Jemez Mountains
Class I-II 6-8 miles roundtrip

A nice variety of ski terrain with fantastic views of Redondo Peak. This is a perennial club favorite and the snow is usually excellent. Pack a lunch and some water, dress in layers. Call leader for meeting place and time.

Sun Jan 26 Sandias – Kiwanis Meadows

Another nice trip in the Sandias with great views at the top. Ski from the crest across Kiwanis Meadows onto the service road and up to the tram. Return trip will be a slightly different route. Call leader for meeting place and time.

We'll ski this fun loop and get a little exercise in. Trail selection may change slightly depending on snow conditions. Meet at Smith's grocery store (northwest corner of the parking lot), Central/Tramway, at 8:30 AM.



Winter Park – 4-5 day trip

Thurs-Mon Feb 27-Mar 3, 2003 Winter Park, CO
Class II and III ski miles: mild to massive

This trip will give priority to long ski-intensive days, with provisions for those who prefer shorter days. The main ski group will be on the road by 8:00am each day, returning late afternoon. Other groups (actually the majority!) will do shorter days.

We will be traveling by carpool, and staying in condos. Some will leave Thursday morning and drive directly to Winter Park. Others will leave Thursday evening, staying the night in Buena Vista. We will drive back starting Monday around noon.



Cost will be about \$300.-\$325., including all lodging and a contribution for the drivers.

Winter Park is at 9000' in northern Colorado, west of the Continental Divide. It usually has better (sometimes much better) snow conditions than southern Colorado. The Fraser Experimental Forest (no snowmobiles!) and two Wilderness areas are just outside town. Somewhat to the north are the Arapaho National Forest, Rocky Mountain National Park, and the Indian Peaks Wilderness. In addition, there are two large prepared-track areas, Devil's Thumb and Snow Mountain, each with 100 km of trails.

Race information: The Snow Mountain Stampede, a major regional ski race, will be held March 1, the Saturday we're there! There will be 10 km, 21 km, and 42 km events. We will try to accommodate those who wish to enter one of these events.
